## 2. Threat 2: Cloning and Re-birthing (The Highest Risk)

"Cloning" is the act of giving a stolen vehicle the identity of a legally operating vehicle of the same make, model, and colour.

Technique	Description	Risk to Owner
<b>The 'Write-Off' Scam</b>	Syndicates purchase the legitimate registration papers (logbook) and VIN from an accident-damaged vehicle that has been officially "written off."	The identity is transferred onto a stolen car. The original owner's identity and documents are now being used to commit fraud.
<b>The 'Dormant File' Scam</b>	Criminals use corrupt officials to access the records of vehicles that were manufactured or imported but never properly registered (e.g., vehicles exported overseas).	A stolen vehicle is registered using the clean "dormant" details, making it appear legitimate on the <b>eNaTIS</b> (National Traffic Information System).
<b>The 'Parting Out' Threat</b>	A stolen vehicle is immediately stripped for high-value parts (engines, gearboxes, control units, body panels).	<b>These parts are virtually untraceable</b> and sold through legitimate-looking channels, making recovery of the vehicle's value almost impossible.

## III. The Microdot Mitigation Strategy

Microdots are not an alarm or a tracking device; they are an **identity marker** that addresses the core of the criminal business model: the need for untraceable identity.

### 1. The Microdot Advantage

The system applies up to **10,000 microscopic polyester dots** to approximately 70-100 different locations on a vehicle and its major component parts (engine, gearbox, body panels, etc.). <b>Second-Hand Goods Act, 2009</b>	<b>Section 21</b>	<b>Dealer Accountability:</b> Requires all registered motor vehicle dealers to <b>record the microdot information</b> in their register for every second-hand vehicle they acquire or sell, making the failure to check for microdots a criminal offence.
